Who is the mayor working for? The city...or "Big Pharma"?

William Davidson, Mayor of Aniline City, confirmed yesterday that papers had been signed to build a second housing development in Lower Aniline. This news comes as part of Phase 2 of his reformation plans for the city — providing more affordable housing options.

His plans were welcomed in his campaign, and at first glance, he seems to be keeping a lot of his promises. Work is underway on the new treatment plant, which boasts a reduction in waste than the older manufacturing plants, along with better treatment facilities to deal with existing waste.

But is everything as it seems? An anonymous source has told Aniline City News that the houses in the first development in Lower Aniline are being offered as first priority to hospital staff and corporate employees, instead of the people who were already living in Lower Aniline but were in desperate need of better housing.

"I think he's made a deal" our source tells us "all the new houses are for the pharma people, not the people who actually need them."

The Mayor and his office have not responded with a comment when approached with this story.
